Adam and Eve were created from an apple tree. Noah's wife was Joan of Ark, because Noah built an ark. The animals came on in pears.

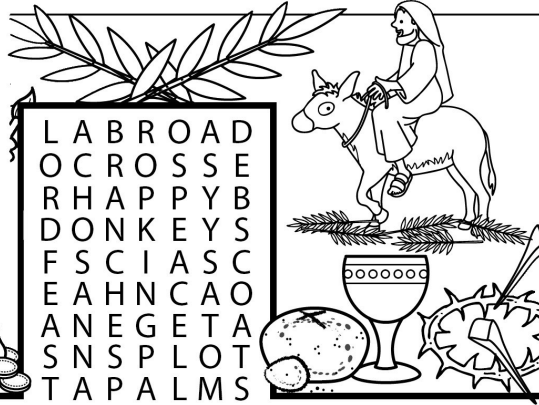
Moses led the Jews to the Red Sea, where they made unleavened bread which is bread without any ingredients.
